Progress so far

Neighbourhood plans can influence the designs of new homes, other buildings and the linking spaces in between. They can also express a view on streets and infrastructure, tourism, leisure and community facilities and environmental issues.

Earlier this year, Hawkhurst Parish Council ran several successful public consultation events to help reveal the issues that most matter to the local community. Working with Feria Urbanism, a team of professional planners and designers, it tested how these issues could be best addressed by a neighbourhood plan. The emerging concepts and ideas were further tested over the summer months through a questionnaire.

These key issues and the possible ways they could be addressed will be reflected in both the shared vision for Hawkhurst and in the diagrams, drawings and well-written policy text that will comprise the final neighbourhood plan.
